Applications for Ross University School of Veterinary Medicine can be completed online by going to [www.RossU.edu](http://www.RossU.edu). All letters of recommendation and transcripts must be mailed to the Ross University Admissions Office: 630 US Highway 1, North Brunswick, NJ 08902.

A complete application consists of the following documents:

- A completed Ross University application.
- Official transcript(s) from each college and/or professional school attended (transcripts must include the required minimum of 90 credits and all prerequisite courses must be either completed or in progress). Degree-granting transcripts must contain a graduation date.
- Two official letters of recommendation, which become the property of Ross University: one academic letter from a pre-health or pre-vet professor acquainted with the applicant's academic ability or a recommendation from a college pre-health or pre-vet advisory committee; one from a veterinarian acquainted with the applicant's veterinary experience, if applicable. All letters must be on proper letterhead with contact information included, and sent directly from the recommender to the Ross University Admissions Office.
- Graduate Record Examination (GRE) scores or Medical College Admission Test (MCAT) scores.
- Official report of scores on the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), if applicable.
- Record of experience working with animals.
- A passport-sized photo of yourself (optional).
- \$100.00 USD application fee (non-refundable).

If you are applying as a transfer student, you must also submit the following documentation:

- Letter of intent that includes: a cogent, well-written explanation of the student's reason(s) for requesting a transfer; an indication of the semester of the curriculum into which transfer is requested; and the student's enrollment status in the college of veterinary medicine from which he/she wishes to transfer.
- Letter of character and academic reference (including class ranking) from the associate dean of the college of veterinary medicine or his/her designee from which he/she wishes to transfer.
- Two letters of reference from former instructors who are members of the faculty of the college of veterinary medicine from which the student wishes to transfer.
